6 con las que aún no tenemos plena relación ecuarística. Si dicho canon se estima conveniente, esta  
7 Convención instruye a la Comisión Permanente sobre Relaciones Ecu­m­e­n­i­c­as que cree dicho  
8 canon para su consideración por la 77ª Convención General.

EXPLANATION:

With the permission of my bishop and at the appointment of the Bishop of the DesertSouthwest Conference of the United Methodist Church, I am serving part-time as a cross-denominational appointed pastor of a United Methodist congregation which seeks to be openly and intentionally multi-denominational in a tiny town which has no Episcopal, ELCA (or Presbyterian) church. I am mutually accountable at this time to my bishop and the United Methodist District Superintendent and Bishop of the Desert Southwest Conference of The United Methodist Church. While the Episcopal Church is already partnered with many ELCA congregations, and while both the United Methodists and the ELCA have guidelines in place for ecumenical shared ministries, we do not. The proposed canon could address such matters as the expected contents of an ecumenical shared ministry agreement (property, apportionments, connections, etc.) and dual (if not multiple) clerical accountabilities.
