

INTRODUCTION TO 81st GENERAL CONVENTION

Welcome to the 81st General Convention of The Episcopal Church!

Thank you for agreeing to serve at the 81st General Convention. Your leadership is essential to the church's discernment of God's mission, and individually and collectively you are among the most distinguished leaders of The Episcopal Church.

I am the 26th Secretary of the General Convention to have served in this role since our first meeting in 1785. During those early years, our church found itself in the middle of one of the great scourges of the time – yellow fever – and an early convention was postponed because of concerns for the safety and welfare of those attending. In 2021, we followed the example of our forebears, and postponed the 80th General Convention for a year. That convention, held in the summer of 2022, was a truncated gathering, held under complicated health protocols and precautions. Two years later, we are looking forward to a larger assembly of Episcopalians and friends, taking the lessons of the past into a new, expectant future for the Church. We are excited and ready to welcome you to the beautiful city of Louisville, Kentucky in June 2024.

To host The Episcopal Church in convention requires years of planning, thousands of volunteers, and the amazing work of the staff of the General Convention Office – eleven extraordinary people whose faithful efforts have supported us through many adaptations and changes over the years. I am grateful to the wonderful people of the General Convention Office – the GCO – and to the thousands of volunteers from throughout The Episcopal Church, and especially from our hosts, the Diocese of Kentucky and the City of Louisville. I hope you will join me in expressing your gratitude to them as we meet in June.

This handbook has been prepared to give you essential information as you prepare for your role at convention. Together with the Blue Book reports, committee meetings and hearings, and other engagements, I hope this will give you the knowledge you need for the important work ahead.
