The Committee divided into three groups to discuss 1) the positives; 2) the critical issues 3) where to we go from here. The results of that work:

The Positives:

- UN status of women's strength in different voices: "Commitment to unity that does not require conformity"
- The passion of mission as a natural link to Anglican identity and healing.
- Growth in ERD Number of donors up, number of parishes up, foundation & corporate donors up, total receipts up.
- Amazing Gulf Cost work
- Dialogue with Methodists
- Youth/Young Adults
 - 7 new campus ministry plants
 - 28 diocese better prepared adult baptisms, confirmations & receptions up
- Communications Episcopal Life Online w/ 174,000 unique users in first 3 months of launch
- Small Church ministry as a model of services going to congregation/dio/prov
- More and better research, data, especially demographics
 - Trend data is not all good but is accurate for better planning
- Evangelism imperative
- Churches clear identity and mission/outreach are growing whether large or small
- PB's role
- Opportunities for Evangelism
 - Disenchanted with fundamentalist mega churches
 - o Young
- First time in 200 years to rearticulate polity in response to the Communiqué
- Opportunity to debate whether we will adopt a confession through the study of the proposed Anglican Covenant.

Critical issues

- declining ASA
- declining \$\$ from dioceses
- declining membership demographic issues
- changing expectations of culture and community
- angst & concern for way forward compassion for benefit right, left center
- changing context for leadership development : developing and vocabulary
- seminary education: finance for students & seminaries & age; issues with traditional 3-year and educated at dio level (not M.Div)
- Identity
 - o Baptism / Eucharist
 - Claim our baptismal & Eucharistic identify
- relationship with Worldwide Anglican Communion
 - danger of isolationism
 - o others set our agenda
 - being asked for a confession (covenant)
 - o polity
- issue of 815 staff
- wearing down of leadership
- growing need to react
- too many CCAB's
- we are so far behind with technology......staff doesn't have resources to do their job

Keys for moving ahead:

- Eagerness for mission, but weakness in Identity and Purpose
 - critical for sustaining mission
 - evangelism balanced by compassion
- Related
 - Learn to disagree with respect and love and to welcome all to the Lord's table and to shared leadership of the Church
- Changes?
 - o 815 & GC restatement (Linda etc.
 - Leadership Development (Rebecca)
 - Evangelism and Purpose
 - Well-positioned for the future
 - o Jesus Christ as source of focus of mission & unity
